Can you do a survey by asking your family and friends (Remember to message or video call them) You could use a tally chart to organise your data. Can you make a pictogram of your findings? (Reception and Year 1) Draw round your foot or a grown up's foot and pretend it the Giant's footsteps. What objects can you find that are the same length or longer than the footprints. |
| Topic | Can you use different materials to make a beanstalk? You could take a photo and pretend you are climbing up too! Can you find a song that has the sound of a harp in it? How does the music make you feel? |
