Week Beginning 18.5.20 (Week 5)

<i>English</i>	<p>This week we are going to be learning about the story of Rapunzel. Read your own version or a version can be found here https://www.storiestogrowby.org/story/early-reader-rapunzel-fairy-tale-story-kids/</p> <p>Use the internet to find a picture of a tower. Use your imagination and answer these questions. What is it? Where is it? Who or what is inside? How would you get to the top if there was no door?</p> <p>Research the story of St Barbara, what similarities are there between the story of Rapunzel and St Barbara. https://www.catholicculture.org/culture/liturgicalyear/activities/view.cfm?id=1145 (<i>Bears</i>)</p> <p>Design a job advert for someone to rescue Rapunzel. What skills and qualifications would they need?</p>
<i>Vocabulary, Grammar and Punctuation.</i>	<p>Learn about words with contractions. For example didn't, can't.</p> <p>Look at different books around your house. How many words can you find with contractions?</p> <p>Make a list of all the words. If you find the words more than once, practice writing them again and see if you can make your writing even neater than before. Don't forget to join your letters too.</p>

<i>Topic</i>	<p>Use different materials to create a tower. How high can you make it? Can you add to it each day? Remember to take photos of your creations. Choose a local tower to research. You could research Cow Tower in Norwich. What facts can you find? Can you make a leaflet showing all of the information?</p>
<i>Extra Challenge</i>	<p>Use your garden as an inspiration. Can you create your own fairy-tale mini garden using natural materials?</p> <p>Use whatever materials you have to create a detailed piece of artwork of your fairy-tale garden. You could use plant rubbings to enhance your piece. Take a photograph or stick the piece in your home learning book.</p>

<i>Science</i>	<p>Can you design a tower to keep Rapunzel imprisoned? What materials would you use? Think about the suitability of the materials. Why did you choose each material? Go on a material hunt around your house.</p> <p>Research people who have developed useful new materials for example Charles Mackintosh or John Dunlop. What facts can you find?</p>
<i>Extra Challenge</i>	<p>Study your garden and if you go out on a walk study that area too! Did you spot any animals or insects? What birds have you spotted? Can you take a photograph or even a video? What facts can you find out about them? Have a look at Maddie and Greg scientists.
