Imagine that you are with a friend and one of you wants to go inside the tomb and the other doesn't. Can you add this into your story? Remember to use speech marks to show direct speech.</p> <p>You can now enter the tomb... using your experience of the virtual tour, describe the tomb in great detail. How does it feel? What can you see? What is the temperature both outside the tomb and then inside the tomb? What pictures can you see on the walls?</p> <p>Can you add pictures to your story too?</p> <p>Now I is coming and you do not want me to discover you are in the tomb! What do you do? Where do you hide? What happens next? See what interesting words you can use to make your writing exciting. For example <i>I paused, no one was looking so I cautiously crept over to the entrance of the tomb.</i></p>
