

# **Rabbit Class Topic information**

## **Summer 1 2026**

**English:** This term, we will link our class text *Egyptology* by Dugald Steer with our history topic. Through exploring the book, children will develop their reading comprehension and writing skills, including learning how to write diary entries. Grammar will continue to be taught explicitly to support strong writing.

**Spellings:** Spellings are taught daily in school through repetition and use in different contexts. Children are placed in streamed spelling groups to ensure learning is matched to their level. We no longer send spellings home or hold weekly tests; instead, children complete a half-termly spelling assessment.



**History:** We will explore the question: *What was important to the ancient Egyptians?* The children will learn about Egyptian beliefs and practices, as well as the importance of

the River Nile.

**RE:** Our RE unit focuses on the question: *What do Muslims believe about God?* Children will learn what is important to Muslims and how beliefs influence daily life.

**Art:** Children will study ancient Egyptian art and create their own pieces. As part of this unit, they will make their own paper and use it to create scrolls.

### **Maths**

This half term, we will focus on fractions.

- **Year 2:** recognising and finding halves, quarters and thirds of shapes and objects
- **Year 3:** counting, comparing, ordering, adding and subtracting fractions



Children are encouraged to explore fractions in everyday contexts, such as sharing food.



**Computing:** our unit will explore computing systems and the term 'IT'. It will look at how the internet is used around the world and how to use it safely.

**French:** we will be learning new vocabulary and developing our writing skills through the book *Goldilocks and the Three Bears*.

**Music:** Our music unit, *Just Three Notes*, will teach children how to create simple rhythms and melodies using the notes C, D and E.

**PSHE:** in our unit, 'Staying Safe' children will learn how to stay safe in different life situations, such as road safety and internet safety.

**PE:** In PE, the children will be learning to play striking and fielding games. As well as team game opportunities, they will learn skills associated with throwing, catching and striking.

**Outdoor learning:** Our weekly Friday Forest School sessions will continue, helping children build confidence and skills through outdoor learning.
